Scaife Family Sea Turtle Care Complex

This lifesaving facility will provide rehabilitative care and long-term sanctuary to sick and injured sea turtles and inspire the community to take action to protect them. Building on the model of Brevard Zoo's Sea Turtle Healing Center, the Care Complex will allow visitors to view our turtles' care and medical treatment in real time, fostering connections between people and turtles.



Canaveral Lock

Modeled after the locks in the Port, which provide a vital connection between the ocean and Indian River lagoon, this building will feature a 32,000+ gallon "Locks" habitat and will be home to snook, jack crevalle, sheephead and more. With air conditioning, play areas for children and a seahorse habitat, this building will surely be a family favorite.



Dr. Duane De Freese Coastal Conservation Hub

Named in honor of the Executive Director of One Lagoon, this three-story building will be a center for coordinating and facilitating regional restoration, research, and education efforts, featuring classrooms, wet labs, research facilities, meeting space, and a free-to-the-public Restoration Science Research Center.



Shark Flats & Ray Encounter

Our Shark Flats habitat will recreate the coastal shallows where native sharks are most commonly found, framed by breathtaking views over the Banana River. Guests can then wade alongside the shark's relative, the stingray, at our immersive Ray Encounter. This area will highlight the importance of healthy predator populations and how we can live alongside them.

Event Complex

A stunning, three-story Event Complex will encompass a range of indoor pre-function event spaces and outdoor decks. The complex will offer multi-use venues for scientific meetings, community events, corporate gatherings, and private parties, with unrivaled views of rockets launching from Kennedy Space Center.

Manatee Critical Care Center & Habitat

The critical care facility will showcase our commitment to caring for sick, injured, and malnourished manatees, featuring rehabilitation and medical tanks and a stunning exhibit where guests can sit and admire these peaceful herbivores as they heal before their release back to their natural home.
